



Parking Guidelines for the area at the Bailiff's Hut, Island Pond

Angus Council has agreed to allow parking at the Bailiff's hut for a trial period from March 2 until June 30, 2019.

Angus Council and Monikie Angling Club reserve the right to amend the following guidelines, or suspend the trial.

ALL DRIVERS MUST OBEY THE 15mph SPEED LIMIT WITHIN THE PARK AND BEWARE OF, AND GIVE WAY TO, ALL OTHER PARK USERS.

Parking is prohibited on the grass area around the hut and drivers should avoid driving on any grass area, even when turning to go back to the public car park.

Parking is on a first come basis. However, the duty Bailiff has absolute authority, along with Angus Wildlife rangers, with regard to parking at the hut area.

Twelve spaces are available for parking by anglers at the Bailiff's hut. One space is reserved for the Bailiff with a further two spaces allocated for Blue Badge holders or anglers with a special parking permit issued on medical grounds (backed by GP letter) at the discretion of the Committee.

Should more than two anglers with the above permissions arrive for the same fishing session, they will be given priority over able-bodied fishermen.

With this in mind anglers are asked to car share wherever possible, even just by leaving one of their cars in the public car park, so helping to limit the number of cars parked at the hut.

If the car park is full, anglers are allowed to drop off their equipment at the hut, then park their car in the public car park, taking care not to drive on the grass while turning.

NB – during the evening sessions the entry/exit barrier near the toilet block is locked at 9pm. If anglers intend leaving after 9pm, but before the fishing session ends, they must park in the main public car park.
